Dietitians and nutritionists are experts in the use of food and nutrition to promote health and manage disease. They advise people on what to eat in order to lead a healthy lifestyle or achieve a specific health-related goal. The mission of <u>UNM's Nutrition and</u> <u>Dietetics B.S. program</u> is to educate individuals for the profession of dietetics by providing a sound background in foundational knowledge and skills needed in areas of dietetics practice: community, clinical, and food service management.

The University of New Mexico is one of two programs in the state that is accredited by Accreditation Council for Nutrition and Dietetics (ACEND) of the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics (AND).

Most states require licensure and will vary by state: <u>How to become a Registered</u> <u>Dietitian Nutritionist</u> (RDN). New Mexico requires licensure to practice as an RDN.


