Art and Music educators help to foster creativity, free expression, and develop fine motor skills in the students they teach. Numerous articles have praised the importance and long lasting benefits that art and music has on students across all levels. Once a career in decline, many cities and states are realizing the importance of art and music education in the development of students. In 2019, Albuquerque Public Schools started an initiative to expand fine arts programs in elementary schools. UNM's College of Fine Arts offers four degrees for students interested in pursuing a career in arts education. Students are encouraged to Speak with a College of Fine Arts academic advisor to discuss the requirements for each degree.

Bachelor of Arts in Art Education (BA)

UNM's BA prepares students to become art teachers in K-12 classrooms. After completing the program, students are eligible to apply for New Mexico teaching licensure. Students must pass the BA-AE screening criteria before admittance to the program.

Bachelor of Music Education (BME)

There are two concentrations for students interested in UNM's BME degree. <u>The Instrumental Concentration</u> allows students to teach any music class in K-12 levels. <u>The Vocal Concentration</u> includes an emphasis in strings, winds, percussion, piano, or guitar and prepares students to teach choir or other vocal classes in a K-12 setting. Both concentrations allow students who complete the program to apply for a New Mexico teaching license.

Bachelor of Arts in Interdisciplinary Arts (BAIA)

The BAIA degree will allow students to explore multiple creative disciplines while studying artistic pedagogy. Students will also have the opportunity to explore art theory and practice, artistic management, and grant writing.

Bachelor of Music in String Pedagogy

Students follow a rigorous and comprehensive curriculum that explore the works of Galamian, Kendall, Rolland, and Suzuki. There is an interdisciplinary portion of study that focuses on areas like child development, human cognition, and running your own private studio. Students in the program teach at the UNM Lab School, where community children ages 3 through high school receive private lessons.

Industries & Occupations







Yearly Wages for Elementary School Teachers, Except Special Education in NM


