The UNM School of Architecture + Planning offers a Bachelor of Arts in Environmental Planning and Design (BAEPD) and an Undergraduate Minor in Community & Regional Planning. For graduate studies, a Master of Community and Regional Planning (MCRP) with concentrations in Community Development, Indigenous Planning, Natural Resources and Environmental Planning, and Physical Planning and Design are offered. The three different dual degree programs are also available in the MCRP program, as well as a Graduate Minor in Community & Regional Planning.


