

CAREERS FOR History MAJORS

History is more than studying the past. An understanding of how the world currently came to be and the examination of complex relationships between people, cultures, and society are brought to life in this degree. History allows individuals to explore the world and beyond through the stories, and <u>UNM's Department of History</u> is filled with scholars and historians who are active in their field. For students interested in the southwest, <u>The New Mexico Historical Review</u> is a quarterly academic journal that explores the vibrant people and cultures of the state.

The Department of History offers a <u>Bachelor of Arts in History</u> with a <u>structured outline</u> <u>of student learning outcomes for the degree</u>. It is suggested that students speak with an <u>academic advisor</u> to learn more about the requirements for this degree.

There are many different career opportunities available to philosophy majors. While the majority of careers require a bachelors, other careers will need additional education (lawyer, researcher, professor, etc.) or licensure (K-12 educator).




Yearly Wages for Museum Technicians & Conservators in NEW MEXICO






CAREER ONE STOP


