MAJORS

To learn a new language is not only to gain a new skill, but to open a door into a new way of seeing the world. Languages majors provide students with foundational written and spoken proficiency as well as a thorough study of the peoples, cultures and histories of the language. Study abroad programs form a key part of language studies, allowing students to get intensive practice and real-world experience. Several languages majors are available at UNM, each with a distinctive history and cultural context. Because students in these majors often have similar career interests, we have grouped them together for the purposes of this guide. Please see our separate guide for Signed Language Interpreting. Languages majors offered at UNM include:

Graduate School & Other Training

No further training beyond a bachelor's degree is required to become an interpreter or translator, though a <u>certification</u> is helpful to demonstrate your skills. Certifications may be required for specialized services, like court and medical interpretation. Some graduates continue with graduate study in their chosen language. Others pursue training to get the licensure required for certain professions, like law, teaching and social work. Graduates who wish to teach public school may pursue <u>alternative teacher licensure</u>. A license is usually not required for other kinds of teaching, like teaching English in another country, teaching English to adults in the community, or one-on-one language tutoring. A <u>Teaching English as a Foreign Language (TEFL)</u> certification is helpful, however, and may be required by some employers.
